STATEMENT

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that the UNITED PHONOGRAPHS CORPORATION, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Wisconsin, and located and doing business at Port Washington, in the county of Ozaukee and State of Wisconsin, has adopted for its use the trade-mark shown in the accompanying drawings, for phonographs and phonograph-records, in Class 36, Musical instruments and supplies.

The trade-mark has been continuously used in the business of said corporation since October 20, 1917.

The trade-mark is applied to the goods by decalcomania transfers, by placing on the goods metal plates bearing the mark, or by printing said mark directly on the goods and upon packages containing the same, or by placing on the goods a printed label bearing the mark.
